Dry Eye Syndrome What? So What? Now What?

Dry Eye Syndrome occurs when there is a loss of stability in the eye's tear film (the natural layer coating the front of the eye).

What causes dry eye syndrome?

- The cornea is a clear, dome-shaped surface at the front of the eye that helps focus light on the retina.
 - The cornea is covered by a natural tear layer, known as the **tear film** that functions as a healthy buffer and interface to help focus light.
 - If this tear film becomes dysfunctional, irritation occurs to causes a reflex of tears to counteract the problem.
 - However, reflex tearing is often

How do dry eyes present?

A prominent symptom of dry eyes is **tearing.** While this syndrome is referred to as *dry eye*, *tearing* is a prominent symptom that occurs due to dysfunction of the tear film.

Some risk factors include, but are not limited to:

- Allergies
- Age (> 50 years old)
- Eyelid inflammation
- Infrequent blinking increased screen times
- Contact lens use

Why are dry eyes important?

Dry eye syndrome is a common ocular condition that ranges in symptom severity on impact of quality of life.

Early intervention through a comprehensive eye exam can greatly improve long-term visual health.

- Burning
- Sandy-gritty eye irritation

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Other symptoms include:

- Discharge
- Frequent blinking and blurry vision
- Light-sensitivity
- Pain

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
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What are my treatment options?

<u>What you can do to help:</u>

- Artificial tears
 - Preservative free
- Artificial tear gel and ointments • Longer acting
- Warm compresses
 - 10 minutes, two times/day
- Eyelash and eyelids scrubs
- Tea tree oil wipes



<u>What we can do to help:</u>

- Prescription Medications
 - Restasis (cyclosporine 0.05%)
 - Cequa (cyclosporine 0.09%)
 - Xiidra (lifitegrast 5%)

• Autologous Serum Tears

Specifically compounded artificial tears mixed with patient's serum (blood).

• Plasma Rich Growth Factor (PRGF) / Autologous Serum Tears

- Involves obtaining plasma from the patient's own blood, which is rich in proteins called growth factors that help with ocular surface tissue regeneration.
- Better suited for patients with systemic infiltrates.

• LipiFlow

Automated meibomian (oil) gland heating and manual expression procedure.

• Intense Pulsed Light (IPL) Therapy

 Involves loosening the clogged Meibomian (oil) glands through the use of light therapy and treatment of unwanted blood vessels along the lid margins.

• Radiofrequency (RF)

• Involves heating the clogged Meibomian (oil) glands while allowing for their expression through the applied pressure.

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
